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ACADEMIC UPDATES

SCIENCE MATTERS AT STS!

At Saint Teresa, we believe science is a vital part of educating the whole child. Through our science program, students not only learn about the physical world, but they also deepen their understanding of the incredible order and beauty of God's creation. We encourage curiosity, critical thinking, and collaboration, all while fostering a sense of wonder that will serve them throughout their lives. Here are some of the exciting projects across the grades this week:

- Kindergarten has been introduced to the study of botany as each student is growing his or her own plant "the children and plant will grow together throughout the year".
- Grade 1 will be beginning a unit on the human body and they continue working with their STEAM Bins where Ms. Connors promotes builders, architects, inventors, accountants, designers and florists.
- Grade 2 has been studying matter, examining what matter is, its properties, and how it changes.
- Grade 3 just completed an astronomy unit on the phases of the moon
- Grade 4 has been studying cell biology, specifically organelles. They have been using microscopes and are preparing to make 3D cells
- Grade 5 has been studying the properties of matter and have been testing objects to see if they have hardness, solubility, magnetic forces, texture, and color
- Middle School. Grade 6 has been studying energy; grade 7 has been studying motion; grade 8 has been studying atoms. After the long weekend, all middle school students will have the opportunity to participate in a Motion Challenge inspired by the 7th-grade unit on motion. We will measure the distance around the school and how long it takes students to run a lap. Using this data, students will calculate their speed. Participation in the running portion is optional. Students who choose not to run can assist by using stopwatches to record times.
